Grants

The Nottingham General Dispensary. A medical charity that makes grants towards the cost of items and/or services to people living in Nottinghamshire, which are required due to a medical need but not available via the NHS or local authorities. The charity's funds are not allowed to be used to relieve public funds, nor are the Trustees permitted to repeat or renew the relief granted on any occasion in any case.

Nottingham Gordon Memorial Trust for Boys and Girls. The charity provides grants for items, services, or facilities to individuals under the age of 25, living in the City of Nottingham who is in conditions of need, hardship, or distress. The trustees are not however permitted to use any part of the Trust Funds to pay for rates, taxes, or public funds. Neither are they permitted to renew any relief granted on any occasion.

If over the age of 25 but have children, the Trustees may still consider an application. The scheme also promotes education and will provide funds to enable an applicant under the age of 25 to pursue their training/ education, and may provide grants for clothing, tools, instruments, or books including overseas educational trips.

Perry Trust Gift Fund. Trustees make grants to individuals of good character who have lived in Nottingham for at least 5 years, in need of financial assistance to maintain a reasonable standard of living. Applications are considered twice a year in May and November.

St Mary's Relief in Need. Grants are made for items, services or facilities to individuals living in the city of Nottingham who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress. For application forms for any of the above, please email: anna.chandler@freethcartwright.co.uk
